DEFINITIONS

Commercial Provider: means organisations that offer legal education as a business or commercial enterprise.

Legal Professional Providers: means law societies and other legal membership societies and bodies (other than those that fall into the category of volunteer and community organisations), all law schools and State and Federal government departments and large professional associations.

Law Practices: has the same meaning as in the Legal Profession Act 2008, and who provide in-house CPD to their employees and clients.

Discussion groups: means a group of 2 or more legal practitioners/legal practices who form a group for the purposes of providing CPD to members of the group.

Community groups and small non commercial member organisations:
that:

- (i) are community based not for profit and/or a charity; and
- (ii) provide CPD for their members, where the organisation is predominately run by volunteers with limited or no paid support and where CPD is provided at a minimal cost.
